WHY ATTEND?

About half of all military veterans in the United States do not receive care in the federal Veterans Health Administration. Nearly all family members of veterans rely on the civilian healthcare system and on community social services for support. The ability to provide effective, culturally competent care for this unique population is essential for health care providers.

Factors such as deployment, combat exposure and military-specific environmental exposures create a set of health needs unique to the patient who is a military veteran or for a family member of a veteran.

GOAL:

The goal of this symposium is to build the capacity of our region's emergency personnel, first responders and mental health workforce to better serve our returning veterans and their families.

AUDIENCE:

This conference will provide training to health care providers, first responders, ED staff and social services professionals.

LEARNER OBJECTIVES:

After participating in this educational activity, attendees should be able to:

- Provide examples of challenges facing today's military families.
- Describe ways to better understand and provide solutions to strengthen military families.
- Identify methods to build better support networks for military families.
- Define the various components of military and veteran life in Massachusetts.
- Describe the various laws and entitlements as they apply to family members.
- Discuss and describe the financial challenges that family members face.
- Utilize the resources that are available to assist family members.
- Demonstrate knowledge of prevalent physical health conditions facing veterans.
- Describe ways that these physical health issues affect family members.
- Reveal knowledge about toxic exposures, substance use disorder and co-occurring conditions.
- Demonstrate understanding of the role of caregiving by family members.
- Demonstrate knowledge of the behavioral health conditions facing veterans including post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)/post-traumatic stress (PTS) and reveal ways that these behavioral health issues affect family members.
- Demonstrate knowledge associated with suicide risk and prevention.
- Demonstrate knowledge associated with intimate partner violence.
- Describe optimal treatment interventions and the role of caregiving.
- Identify ways in which stressors associated with the military lifecycle impact children at different developmental stages in military and veteran families.
- Identify developmentally appropriate strategies for assisting families with children at different stages of the military lifecycle.
